

I never understood the value of having good credit until it was too late. I remember the first time that I really needed to have good credit and I didn't. Like most people, my credit problems began when I was in college. My parents never taught me about spending, saving, or about paying bills. For the most part when I left for college, I was on my own. Because I had worked through high school and had some money saved, I wasn't too worried at first. By my second semester my savings were nearly *depleted* and I had begun applying for credit.

I struggled to pay my bills after graduating from college, but I still did not learn. In my early twenties, I applied for and received a high line of revolving credit. Within six months after my graduation, the account had been closed due to non payment, meaning that I still had to pay for the credit, but they would not extend credit to me in the future.

When you have serious debt problems, you'd better go to your bank or call your creditor. Speak to them about getting a payment deferment (延期) until you are back on your feet. Sometimes creditors will also work with you on a reduced payment plan if you can afford to pay some or most of your bill. The latter is usually the best option. Even if you can only give them \$10 a month, give it to them. They want to know that you can at least give them something.
